Anyone with a learning disability is entitled to vote as long as:

They are over 18 | They are resident in the UK | They are a citizen of Britain, NI or the Commonwealth. **Voting rights should not be impacted by my mental capacity**, Mental Capacity Act (2005). The Electoral Administration Act (2006) **removes any limitations on me voting based on my mental state**. The Equality Act (2010) places a **duty to make reasonable adjustments** to accommodate my disability/ies.

Other people can; explain the ballot options to me, use their knowledge of my communication methods to understand who I want to vote for, come into the polling booth with me and mark the ballot paper with my decision.

Other people can't; make a decision for me, mark the ballot paper against my wishes or stop me from voting because I have a learning disability.

Valid forms of ID are:

- a UK or Northern Ireland photocard driving licence (full or provisional) | a driving licence issued by an EU country, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein, the Isle of Man or any of the Channel Islands
- a UK passport or a passport issued by an EU country, Norway, Iceland, Liechtenstein or a Commonwealth country | a PASS card (National Proof of Age Standards Scheme)
- a Blue Badge | an older person's bus pass | a disabled person's bus pass
- a biometric residence permit | a Defence Identity Card (MOD form 90) | a national identity card issued by the EU, Norway, Iceland or Liechtenstein | a Northern Ireland Electoral Identity Card
- a Voter Authority Certificate | an Anonymous Elector's Document |
- an Oyster 60+ card | a Freedom Pass | a Scottish National Entitlement Card (NEC) | a 60 and Over Welsh Concessionary Travel Card | a Disabled Person's Welsh Concessionary Travel Card | a Northern Ireland concessionary travel pass
